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### PROCEEDINGS

MR. RICHARDS: Good afternoon. My name is

David Richards, and I'm pleased to open the first meeting

of the Motor Carrier Regulation Advisory Committee. I'm

an Associate General Counsel at the Texas Department of

Motor Vehicles in the Office of General Counsel.

For ease of reference, I'll refer to this advisory committee as the MCRAC, which is the acronym for this committee. It's now 1:02 p.m., and I'm calling the MCRAC meeting for October 20, 2023 to order.

I want to note for the record that the public notice of this meeting containing all items on the Agenda was filed with the Office of the Secretary of State on October 12, 2023. This meeting is being held by telephone conference call in accordance with Texas Government Code 551.125.

Members of the public may physically appear and attend this meeting in person at 4000 Jackson Avenue, Building 1, Lone Star Room, Austin, Texas, or attend the meeting by calling in the toll-free telephone number, which is posted on our Agenda and filed with the Office of the Secretary of State on October 12, 2023. We have one member of MCRAC in person here today in the Lone Star Room, with the rest -- the quorum of members participating remotely.

At this time, will all attendees please mute your phone for the entire duration of this meeting? I'm asking our meeting host to make sure that all participants' phones are muted except for advisory committee members and those who are presenting.

Callers will be removed for any disruption, including background noise. I'd like to remind the participants that this is conference call. Because this meeting is being held by conference call, a few things are in order to assist in making this meeting run smoothly and assist the court reporter in getting an accurate record.

First, please identify yourselves before speaking. Secondly, speak clearly. Thirdly, remember that there may be a slight delay due to the conference call format, so please wait a little bit longer than usual before responding to participants.

Do not speak over others. Please ask the Presiding Officer -- which happens to be me today -- to proceed, and be sure to get recognized before speaking. And finally, for Members participating in the room -- Mr. Connally -- please remember to press your button on your microphone to unmute before speaking, and then press the same button to mute again after speaking.

I would also like to thank our court reporter who is transcribing this meeting. To make sure we have an

accurate record of this meeting, it's very important that advisory committee members and anyone presenting today identify themselves today before speaking and speak clearly and slowly.

The Department's rules under Title 43 Texas Administrative Code, Section 206.22, Presiding Officer is given authority to supervise the conduct of the meetings.

MR. RICHARDS: Members, we do have a quorum and 1 2 we'll proceed on with the Agenda. 3 We'll now move on to Agenda Item 1B, welcoming remarks and introduction of advisory committee members. 4 5 I'll turn the meeting over briefly to Deputy Executive 6 Director for DMV, Shelly Mellott. 7 MS. MELLOTT: Good afternoon. Thanks, Mr. 8 Richards. I want to call you David. 9 My name is Shelly Mellott for the record. I am 10 the Deputy Executive Director here at the Department of Motor Vehicles. 11 12 I'm filling in for Daniel. I know your agenda 13 says Daniel Avitia. I'm his stunt double today. He is 14 out of the office dealing with some other business, but 15 I'm happy to fill in for him. 16 I just want to thank all of you for your time 17 and effort you're putting into being part of this Committee, the Motor Carrier Regulation Advisory Committee 18 19 or -- are we calling it MCRAC? Is that what -- I wasn't 20 sure if we were going MCRAC or MCRAC. 21 So the motor carrier industry is vital to the

So the motor carrier industry is vital to the State's economy and the lives of the residents of this state. The department's adopted rules to establish MCRAC to make recommendations on topics regarding motor carrier registration and regulation.

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The department's advisory committees help to provide inclusive and transparent opportunities for input on the department's rulemaking and policy development.

Department values and welcomes your expertise, thoughts, and honesty. I can't express enough how much I appreciate all of your time and effort in serving on this advisory committee.

The department is available to you to provide you information you need to serve on this committee. Our staff will provide you with background information on the reason for proposed amendments to any rules they're bringing in front of this Committee.

During the next agenda items, Mr. Richards will provide an opportunity for each advisory committee member to introduce themselves and for the committee to select Presiding Officers.

Again, I just want to thank you all for your time and effort in serving. And after that, I will turn it back it over to Mr. Richards and he will go on to the important parts of the agenda.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Shelly.

Members, now moving on to Agenda Item 2A, purpose, general and historical information and scope of the advisory committee.

Before we get into some of those other areas, I

just want to take a brief moment. As a matter of historical background, I'd like to point out or at least discuss the Sunset Advisory Commission Report in 2019, which was our most recent Sunset advisory committee report, addressed issues on advisory committee composition and participation of Board members.

We have rules to that effect as well. First, the staff recommendation, number 1.5, was remove the Board's exemption from balanced representation on advisory committees.

Second, Sunset report addressed Board member involvement in advisory committees' working groups, and provided the following statement, that they believe that such practice risked the appearance of undue influence in policy development, and the Board member participation undermines independent, external expertise.

There was a law that was passed to further the sunset report. The first one to be aware of is in Transportation Code 1001.031, which pertains to advisory committees for the department. It was enacted and provides, in pertinent part, in Subsection (b)(2), the Texas Board shall appoint persons to each advisory committee who -- and under (b)(2) -- have knowledge about the interests in and represent a broad range of viewpoints about the work of the committee or applicable division.

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advisory committees.

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Administrative Code, Section 206.93(c) provides "Board members shall not serve as advisory committee members." And then, finally, another law in effect under Government Code, Section 2110.002, which speaks to the composition of

Secondly, Board rule under 43 Texas

If you'll indulge me, it states that an advisory committee must be composed of a reasonable number of members not to exceed 24 in number. The composition of an advisory committee that advises a state agency regarding an industry or occupation regulated or directly affected by the agency must provide a balanced representation between 1) the industry or occupation, and 2) consumers of services provided by the agency, industry, or occupation.

So that's kind of a background, historically, from Sunset to current law and rule that governs the Texas DMV advisory committees, just for everyone's edification. The purpose of this Motor Carrier Regulation Advisory Committee is to provide advice and to make recommendations to the Board of the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles on topics related to motor carrier regulation.

You've been given the charge by the department to provide advice and recommendations regarding possible amendments to 43 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 218

regarding chameleon carriers.

No other topics will be discussed by this

Committee at this time. There may be others that are

opened up to, but that's the focus of this Committee given

by the department and Board. The Committee provides

advice and recommendations only as requested by the

Department of Motor Vehicles or our Board.

I'd like to congratulate each of you on your appointment to this committee by the Board and thank you again for volunteering your valuable time to assist the department and Board by serving on the committee.

As appointed members of this committee, you are subject to both the Open Meetings Act and the Public Information Act. Just a little background on the Open Meetings Act -- it provides that all public business should be performed in public view.

That means any discussions you have regarding the work you perform with this committee must be done in a properly scheduled and posted meeting. Members of this committee can violate State law by having a series of discussions on policy issues outside of this advisory committee meeting or with others. This is what is referred to as a walking quorum under the Open Meetings Act.

It's important that you refrain from discussing

advisory committee matters with others outside of the scheduled and posted meetings. This includes avoiding meeting with other members outside of properly posted open meetings, not calling other members on the phone to discuss advisory committee matters, and not using social media to discuss matters that are before the advisory committee.

Discussion with other members, even if less than a quorum, outside a properly posted open meeting for the purpose of secret deliberations can violate the Open Meetings Act, which also carries with it potential criminal penalties. In addition, information exchanged in your role as an advisory committee member can be subject to public disclosure under the Open Records Act or the Public Information Act, even if that information is on your private e-mail or cell phone.

This is because, as advisory committee members, information you have regarding matters before the advisory committee may also subject you to open records laws.

Please be aware that any communications you have regarding this committee may be required to be disclosed in response to an open records request from a member of the public.

Finally, in order to ensure that advisory committee meetings run smoothly, advisory committees select a Presiding Officer. The Presiding Officer is in

charge of making sure Robert's Rules of Order are followed to keep the decorum of the meeting.

The Presiding Officer will open the meeting much as I did today and ensure that the quorum of members is present. The Presiding Officer makes sure that members make motions and second the motion before voting, and make sure that no one member has the floor longer than others wishing to provide input on a given subject.

We'll be happy to provide some overview training on the mechanics of the Robert's Rules of Order to anyone wanting to volunteer to be a Presiding Officer of this advisory committee to ensure that it runs efficiently in carrying out its purpose.

Some examples of how Robert's Rules of Order are used to run meetings include: no member can speak twice to the same issue until everyone wishing to speak on an issue has spoken at last once. All remarks by members must be directed to the Presiding Officer prior to speaking.

You obtain the floor by raising your hand or asking the Presiding Officer for the floor or the right to speak on a matter only when that person speaking is finished. And finally, it's important to not to interrupt others and to share the right to speak with all committee members.

Remarks must be courteous, and members must 1 2 avoid referring to viewpoints by alluding to members by 3 name or suggested motives. You expect your Presiding 4 Officer to protect your right to speak, even if it turns 5 out you're a minority of one in your opinion. 6 The Presiding Officer helps to ensure that 7 other members hear you out and allow you the same time as 8 This encourages members to give fellow evervone else. 9 members the rightful turn to speak. Listen to them.

may hear something that affects the way you're thinking as

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Lastly, we're recording this meeting. So, again, before you speak, please state your name for the record so that we can have a record of everything that you happen to say.

Are there any questions at this time before we move on to the next agenda item?

MR. WALKER: Member Walker. I have a question.

MR. RICHARDS: Yes, sir.

MR. WALKER: You mentioned the only thing we're going to talk about today is introduction of the members, the election of or appointment of a Presiding Officer of the panel. But also on this chameleon carrier deal -- I don't know how -- I'm familiar as motor carrier.

But some of these people on there may not

understand what a chameleon carrier is. You might want to take and define that to them.

The other thing is that the calling of this meeting, I believe when I was on the Board there, was at the perusal of the actual Board. But the members of the advisory committee do not call meetings. Is that not still correct?

 $$\operatorname{MR.}$$  RICHARDS: The department called this meeting.

MR. WALKER: So future meetings would be called by whom and for what purpose? It was, when I was there, that the motor carrier Board member of the DMV would call that meeting to get input from motor carriers and the general public how legislation or how laws are affecting them that maybe need to be tweaked. Is that still the same thing that we're doing today?

MR. RICHARDS: What we're contemplating for this meeting, Member Walker, is an election of officers and an introduction of Chapter 218 by Motor Carrier Division Director Jimmy Archer to explain, as you pointed out, what chameleon carriers means to the membership. And that will come up later in the agenda after we elect officers.

As far as future meetings, we'll have another meeting to actually get into the substance of Chapter 218

and any amendments that the advisory committee members would like to make or suggest or recommend to the Texas DMV Board.

So, right now, we have two meetings contemplated. The focus is solely on Chapter 218, chameleon carriers. As I said, Jimmy Archer, the Division Director for the MCD will explain that after we elect officers during this meeting.

MR. WALKER: Thank you.

MR. RICHARDS: Okay, Members, moving along, I'm going to move on to Agenda Item 2B, nominations and selection of Advisory Committee Presiding Officer. Again, for the record, my name is David Richards. I'm Associate General Counsel with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.

Texas law requires the advisory committee to select a Presiding Officer from its membership. The Presiding Officer will preside over the advisory committee and report to the TxDMV and the Board.

What I want to do now is have each member introduce themselves, give a little background information. And at the end, tell me and the members whether you're interested in serving as Presiding Officer for the MCRAC Advisory Committee. Let's start -- Member Althoff?

MR. ALTHOFF: Yes, Kevin Althoff. And I own a 1 2 fleet of trucks and we transport commodities and --3 agriculture commodities and other products over a four or 4 five state area. And I've been directly involved in that, 5 in ownership of it and management of it since 1999. 6 And we also farm on the side. And me and my 7 brother own a commercial truck center and sell fleet fuel 8 and work on trucks and sell truck tires and that kind of 9 stuff. 10 And I would think that there's probably some people on here that have more experience with the meetings 11 12 and the legal side of the meetings that would probably be 13 better for that job than myself. I think I have an 14 extensive knowledge of motor carrier industry, but maybe 15 not a whole lot of experience here with the meetings. 16 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you. Member Byerley, 17 have you joined us?

(No response.)

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MR. RICHARDS: Member Connelly?

MR. CONNELLY: My name is Patrick Connelly.

I'm Vice President of Suarez Brothers Crane and Heavy

Haul. Myself and Mario Suarez started Suarez Brothers in,

I guess, the end of 2011 -- the first of 2012.

Predominantly oilfield haulers -- move drilling rigs and

large machinery. We have cranes, forklifts, a lot of

1 oversize work. 2 Don't know as far as the fit for the chairman or whatever. So, I don't know if I'd be a good fit or 3 4 not. But glad to be here. 5 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you. Welcome. 6 Member Green? 7 MR. GREEN: Green. Industry related -- we have 8 a company that produces -- manufactures oilfield tanks. 9 We move a lot of oversize loads, a lot of permitted loads. 10 And that's how I got involved in the trucking industry. We run a small fleet of trucks. So we're 11 12 probably not the largest party involved in this, and I'm probably not the appropriate Presiding Officer. I think 13 14 there's others that possibly have more experience. 15 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Green. 16 Member Hallmark? 17 MR. HALLMARK: John Hallmark, owner with small fleet, Hallmark Transport Services. We move oilfield 18 goods, a little bit of everything. We also run a septic 19 20 pumping company. 21 I would not personally be interested in running 22 for officer. So that's about it. 23 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Hallmark. Member Hille? 24 25 MR. HILLE: Hille. I work with TCS,

Transportation Compliance Services. We primarily deal with trucking company -- I guess in that industry -- with helping to maintain compliance and DOT [indiscernible 24:33] regulations for the purpose of safety and reducing liability exposure.

I was previously, before this, a police chief and have had 36 years of law enforcement experience before I came to this industry. I would also -- don't believe I would be a good fit for this Presiding Officer thing. I'm not too sure how that would work, so I would like to opt out of that if I could.

MR. RICHARDS: Yes, sir. Thank you, Member Hille.

Member McClure, are you on the call?
(No response.)

MR. RICHARDS: All right. Member McCullah?

(No response.)

MR. RICHARDS: Member Moore?

MR. MOORE: Yes, sir. My name is Dana Moore, and I am currently the Vice President of the Texas

Trucking Association for Government Relations. I retired from DPS after 36 years, leaving there as a sergeant in the Commercial Vehicle Training Unit, and went to work for TXTA. And I'm not interested in taking the Presiding Officer position.

1	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Moore.
2	Member Polk, are you with us today?
3	(No response.)
4	MR. RICHARDS: All right. I'll move on.
5	Member Radde? Or Member Radde?
6	MR. RADDE: Karl Radde. I'm the present
7	owner
8	MR. RICHARDS: Radde. I'm sorry.
9	MR. RADDE: of Southern Comfort Homes.
10	We're a manufactured housing retailer. We move and
11	install manufactured homes within about a 60-70 mile
12	radius of Bryan-College Station.
13	And I'm glad my name ends in R so that there's
14	still people behind me that can also opt out of the option
15	of leading. So, no, I do not feel I have the experience.
16	I wouldn't be comfortable leading the meetings.
17	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Radde.
18	Member Roberts?
19	MR. ROBERTS: I'm Neil Roberts. I'm the Fleet
20	Director for Raider Express. We're a 400 truck
21	refrigerated carrier. We operate 48 states, but probably
22	20 percent of our freight operates in the state of Texas.
23	
24	I would also think that there's probably
25	someone on the panel that has more experience than I would

being the chair.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Roberts.

Member Wagner?

(No response.)

MR. RICHARDS: Member Wagner, are you with us today?

(No response.)

MR. RICHARDS: All right. Member Walker?

MR. WALKER: My name is John Walker. I own

three trucking companies, JH Walker Trucking being our

largest of those, which is an oilfield trucking company

which operates out of Texas, Louisiana. We operate about

350 trucks.

We have another company by the name of Superior Delivery Service, which is a dedicated fleet operation primarily operating in the state of Texas. And our third company is Atlas Couriers, which is a medical courier company. We operate about 100 trucks in that operation, supplying and working with the medical industry and so forth in the cities of Dallas, Houston, and Austin.

I am the former -- I was on the original Board appointed by Governor Perry to serve for eight years on the DMV Board, and I was chairman of that Board for four years. And I'd be more than happy to serve as the director, chairman, or Presiding Officer of this committee

1	if need be.
2	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Walker.
3	Member Willis?
4	(No response.)

9	Members, MCRAC will use Robert's Rules of Order
10	when conducting these meetings as I've stated previously.

12	raise your hand or ask the Presiding Officer which is
13	me at the moment for the right to speak on a matter.
14	Once the Presiding Officer grants you the floor or the
15	right to speak, you must make a motion and another person
16	must second that motion.
17	To make a motion to name someone to be
18	Presiding Officer, the motion could be, for example, I
19	make a motion to name John Walker to be the MCRAC
20	Presiding Officer. You can even make a motion to name
21	yourself to be the Presiding Officer.
22	To second the motion, a different member should
23	say "second" or "I second the motion." A person cannot
24	second their own motion.

So it sounds like from the roll call, Member

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1	Walker is willing the only willing at the moment to
2	serve as Presiding Officer of the MCRAC. So, I would
3	entertain a motion about a membership regarding Mr.
4	Walker.
5	MR. MOORE: This is Member Moore.
6	MR. RICHARDS: Are you making the motion?
7	MR. MOORE: Yes, I'm making a motion for Johnny
8	Walker to be the Presiding Officer.
9	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you. Is there a second?
10	MR. RADDE: Second.
11	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you. Hearing none, I'm
12	going to call for the vote.
13	When I call your name, please answer yes or no
14	regarding your vote for Member Walker to serve as
15	Presiding Officer. Member Althoff?

17	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you. Member Connelly?
18	MR. CONNELLY: Yes.
19	MR. RICHARDS: Member Green?

Our administrative rule on advisory committees allows for the committee to make recommendations to the Board and to the department. The recommendations must be in writing and include any necessary supporting materials.

Presiding Officer of MCRAC or the Presiding
Officer's designee may appear before our Board and present
the committee's advice and recommendations. In addition,
MCRAC can provide advice and recommendations to our
Executive Director Daniel Avitia as necessary.

Our Board will consider MCRAC's recommendations and reports that you submit. When MCRAC comes up with its recommendations at our next meeting, MCRAC can decide that it will attend the Board meeting and make a presentation in addition to submitting written recommendations. They can determine how it will submit its written recommendations to the Board.

I want to introduce those options at this meeting to give you an opportunity to discuss or ask questions, if you have any, in time to think about it before our next advisory committee meeting. Any questions?

MR. WALKER: No.

MR. RICHARDS: Hearing none, I'm going to move on to Agenda Item 2F, implementation plan for the advisory committee recommendations regarding 43 Texas

Administrative Code, Chapter 218.

And I'll turn the meeting over to Motor Carrier Division Director Jimmy Archer and any designated staff to discuss the following items. It's considered amendments to 43 TAC 218 to address chameleon carriers. Thank you.

MR. ARCHER: Thank you, Mr. Richards. Good afternoon. I'm Jimmy Archer. I'm Director of the Motor Carrier Division here at the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles. Then I'm accompanied by Carol Fallin, Section Director of our department's Motor Carrier Licensing and Registration Section.

At this time, the department's considering rule amendments to 43 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 218 regarding motor carriers. The amendments are focused on obtaining relevant information in a motor carrier application process to assist the department in detecting and preventing chameleon carriers.

Chameleon carriers are motor carriers that attempt to continue operating under a certificate of registration without addressing previous penalties or violations under a different certificate of registration.

There are two types of chameleon carriers. The

first is a chameleon carrier that applies to the department for a new certificate of registration to continue to operate as a motor carrier under a different person's name or a different legal entity; and, two, a motor carrier that already has more than one certificate or registration under different names or legal entity.

Under the second type of chameleon carrier, the motor carrier continues to operate under a different certificate of registration when it incurs penalties or violates any statutes or rules under a certificate of registration.

I look forward to hearing your feedback on the proposed amendments regarding chameleon carriers. In addition, we may be asking for your advice and recommendations of other amendments to the rules, including amendments to help prevent fraud in the motor carrier registration process.

Our plan is to provide the rule amendment language to you prior to our next advisory committee meeting so we can have a meaningful discussion on the proposed rule changes.

Again, thank you for your participation on this advisory committee. We look forward to working with you on these very important rule amendments. I'll turn this meeting back over to Mr. Richards.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Jimmy. 1 2 Members, we're going to move on to the next 3 Agenda item, Number 3, public comment. 4 Tameka, are there any public comments from the 5 public? No? Okay. 6 Members, we have no public comments. We'll 7 move on to our final Agenda for today.
