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## PROCEEDING

MR. RICHARDS: Good afternoon. My name is

David Richards, and I'm pleased to open the first meeting

of the Motor Vehicle Industry Regulation Advisory

Committee. I'm associate general counsel at the Texas

Department of Motor Vehicles. For ease of reference, I

will refer to the advisory committee as the MVIRAC, which

is the acronym for the committee.

Now 1:07 p.m., and I'm calling the MVIRAC meeting for August 24, 2023, to order. I want to note for the record that the public notice of this meeting, containing all items on the agenda, was filed with the Office of the Secretary of State on August 16, 2023.

This meeting is being held by conference call in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 551.125.

Members of the public may physically attend this meeting in person at 4000 Jackson Avenue, Building 1, Lone Star Conference Room, Austin, Texas 78731, or attend this meeting by clicking the attendee link or calling the telephone number which is posted on our agenda which was filed with the Secretary of State on August 16, 2023.

We have at the present time four members of the MVIRAC membership here, with the vast majority of the advisory committee members participating remotely.

At this time, will all attendees please mute

yourselves for the entire duration of the meeting. I'm asking our meeting host to make sure all participants are muted except for the advisory committee members and those who are presenting. Callers will be removed for any disruption, including background noise.

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I'd like to remind participants that this is a conference call meeting. Because this meeting is being held strictly by conference call, there are a few things that will assist in making the meeting run smoother and assist the court reporter in getting an accurate record: number one, please identify yourself before speaking. Speak clearly.

Remember that there may be a slight delay due to the conference call format, so please wait a little longer than usual before responding to participants.

Also, do not speak over others, and please ask the presiding officer to proceed and be sure you get recognized before speaking.

I would like to thank the court reporter who is transcribing this meeting.

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I will now move on to the next agenda item, agenda item 1.B., Welcoming remarks and introduction of advisory committee members. We will now move on to this agenda item and I'll turn the meeting over to Executive Director Daniel Avitia.

MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Mr. Richards.

Good afternoon, everyone. I will do my best not to be disruptive, I promise.

Good afternoon, everyone. For the record, my name is Daniel Avitia, and I have the pleasure of serving as the executive director for the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.

Thank you for taking the time today to be a part of this introductory meeting of the Motor Vehicle Industry Regulation Advisory Committee -- try saying that real fast ten times. Before we continue with the introductions on the agenda, I wanted to provide you with some background on the information of this committee.

The TxDMV Board several years ago adopted rules surrounding the establishment of the advisory committees, such as this one, to ensure inclusivity and transparency. This is the second advisory committee to be established so far.

In 2019, the Vehicle Title Registration

Advisory Committee was created and held a few meetings.

The input of that committee's membership has proven very important in helping the department move forward with some of our more significant initiatives and projects. I am certain this committee will provide the same benefit and more.

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This committee has some significant topics to cover, including the agency's administrative rule reviews involving Chapters 206, Management; Chapter 215, Motor Vehicle Distribution; Chapter 221, Salvage Vehicle Dealers; and New Chapter 224, Contested Cases.

We welcome, always, your input and your honesty and your ideas. I cannot express enough how much I appreciate all of your time and your effort as we move forward through these processes. Please know that our staff and I are here to help you with whatever information you need and whatever we can make available to you. We have access to information from other states and the national associations to provide more background and content as we move again through these processes.

I want to thank you once again for your time and your effort and for being here today for many of you and those watching from afar.

I will now turn it back over to Mr. Richards.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Daniel.

We're going to move on to the next agenda item, agenda item 2.A., Purpose, general information and scope of the advisory committee.

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The purpose of the Motor Vehicle Industry

Regulation Advisory Committee is to provide advice and

make recommendation to the Board of the Texas Department

of Motor Vehicles on topics related to motor vehicle

industry issues. You've been given the charge by the

department to provide advice and recommendations over the

coming months regarding rule amendments to Title 43, Texas

Administrative Code, Chapter 206 which covers, as Daniel

said, TxDMV Management; Chapter 214 covering Motor Vehicle

Distribution; 221, which covers Salvage Vehicle Dealers;

and our New Chapter 224, Adjudicative Practice and

Procedure. No other topics will be discussed by his

committee at this particular time.

The committee provides advice and recommendations only as requested by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles or our Board.

We'd like to congratulate each of you for your appointment to this committee by the Board, and thank you again very much for volunteering your valuable time to assist the department and the Board by serving on this committee.

As appointed members of this committee, you are

subject to both the Open Meetings Act and the Public Information Act. Just a little bit of information on that. The Open Meetings Act provides that all public business shall be performed in public view. That means any discussion you have regarding the work that you perform for this committee must be done in a properly scheduled and posted open meeting.

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During an open meeting, please refrain from communicating with each other through text or email, since those communications cannot be seen or heard by the public. Members of this committee can also violate state law by having discussions on policy issues outside these advisory committee meetings with other members. That is what is referred to as a walking quorum.

And under the Open Meetings Act it's also important that you refrain from discussing advisory committee matters with other members outside scheduled and properly posted meetings. This includes avoiding meeting with other members outside of a properly posted meeting, not calling or emailing other members to discuss advisory committee matters, and not using social media to discuss matters that are before the advisory committee.

Discussion with other members, even if less than a quorum, outside of a properly posted meeting can violate the Open Meetings Act, which also carries with it potential

criminal penalties.

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In addition, information exchanged in your role as an advisory committee member can be subject to public disclosure, even if that information is in your private email or cell phone. This is because as advisory committee members, information you have regarding matters before this advisory committee may also subject you to Open Records laws. Please be aware that you have an obligation to preserve your communications regarding this committee, and any communications you have regarding this committee may be required to be disclosed in response to an Open Records request from the public.

Finally, in order to ensure that the advisory committee meetings run smoothly, the advisory committee selects a presiding officer. The presiding officer is in charge of making sure Robert's Rules of Order are followed to keep the quorum of the meeting. The presiding officer will open the meeting, much as I did today, and ensure that a quorum of members are present. The presiding officer makes sure that members make motions and second the motion before voting, and makes sure that no member has the floor longer than others wishing to speak.

We will be happy to provide the membership of this advisory committee with any training on the mechanics of Robert's Rules of Order, and anybody wanting to know,

we can help in that respect.

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Some of the examples of how Robert's Rules of Order are used to run meetings, I'll just lay these out.

No member can speak twice to the same issue until everyone else wishing to speak on an issue has spoken at least once. All remarks by members must be directed to the presiding officer prior to speaking.

You obtain the floor by raising your hand or asking the presiding officer for the floor or the right to speak on a matter, only when that person that is speaking has finished. Finally, it's important not to interrupt others and share the right to speak with all members.

Remarks must be courteous and members must avoid referring to viewpoints by alluding to other members by name or suggested motive.

You expect your presiding office to protect
your right to speak, even if it turns out you're a
minority of one with regard to your opinion. The
presiding officer helps to ensure that other members hear
you out and allow you the same time as everyone else gets.
This encourages members to give your fellow members their
rightful time to speak. Listen to them, you may hear
something that affects the way you're thinking as well.

Lastly, we're recording this meeting so, again, before you speak, please state your name so that we may

get a record of what each person said. 1 2 Are there any questions before I move on? 3 (No response.) MR. RICHARDS: Hearing none, I'll move on to 4 5 agenda item 2.B., Nominations and selection of advisory 6 committee presiding officer. 7 Texas law requires advisory committees to select a presiding officer from its membership. 8 9 presiding officer will preside over the advisory committee 10 and report to the TxDMV and our Board. What we're going to do now is go through the 11 membership that are on this call. Each member, we'd like 12 13 to provide some information about your background, state 14 whether you're interested in being presiding officer of 15 the MVIRAC. 16 I'm going to start at the top of the list. I'm 17 not sure, Member Blassingame, are you on this call? MR. BLASSINGAME: Yes. 18 19 MR. RICHARDS: Would you like to give a little 20 background, please, sir? 21 MR. BLASSINGAME: I spent 48 years in the 22 automotive business. I own a consulting company right 2.3 now, Blassingame Consulting. I consult to franchised 24 dealers, independents and lease companies as to management 25 and best practices, and that's really the story, by golly.

1	MR. RICHARDS: Are you interested in serving as
2	presiding officer?
3	MR. BLASSINGAME: Yes.
4	MR. RICHARDS: Okay. Thank you.
5	Member Bradburn?
6	MR. BRADBURN: My name is Mike Bradburn. I'm
7	in law enforcement 30-plus years. I worked at DMV before.
8	I've been a part of the legislation cycle to
9	get some of the paper tag bills and inspection bills
10	passed. I am not interested.
11	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Bradburn.
12	MR. RICHARDS: Member Donnelly?
13	MR. DONNELLY: [Inaudible]
14	MR. RICHARDS: You're not interested? Okay.
15	Thank you, sir.
16	Member Doran?
17	MR. DORAN: Yes. My name is Laird Doran, vice
18	president of government relations and senior counsel for
19	the Friedkin Group, based in Houston, Texas. It's a
20	consortium of companies that includes Gulf States Toyota,
21	the private distributor for Toyota here in Texas.
22	I have been engaged, one way or another,
23	representing stakeholders in the motor vehicle industry
24	for going on about 20 years, both in private practice and
25	now as in-house lawyer. And I'm a lobbyist as well.

I am not interested in serving as the presiding 1 2 officer. 3 And before I turn it over, Mr. Richards, I did want to just mention that for those of us that have dialed 4 5 in or are doing this via Webex, we cannot hear, for 6 example, when Mr. Donnelly was maybe answering a question 7 there, so for purposes of preserving the record or getting a good record, we're not getting the audio from anybody 8 9 else in the room except for whoever is at the podium, like 10 yourself. 11 Thank you. MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Doran. 12 1.3 Let's go back to Member Donnelly. 14 MR. DONNELLY: Thanks, Laird. 15 My name is Chris Donnelly. I've been in the 16 automotive industry for about 34 years in various forms, 17 most recently the last four years having my own independent auto dealership in Conroe, Texas. 18 19 I would serve if I needed to, but I'm not interested in serving at this point. 20 21 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 22 Member Durant? 2.3 MR. DURANT: A quick point of order. There is 24 a Member Durant and a Member Doran, and I am Thomas 25 I will try my best to enunciate the T in Durant

1 so that we don't get it confused with the Texas drawl we have. 3 I'm the general counsel for Classic Chevrolet and the Classic family of dealerships; that's 19 4 5 dealerships in Texas, Oklahoma and Florida. I'm pleased 6 to be on this committee. It is my first time, however, 7 and I'm not interested in being nominated today. 8 you. 9 Thank you, Member Durant. MR. RICHARDS: 10 Member Elam? MR. ELAM: Good afternoon, everyone. I'm Phil 11 I'm the executive director of the Texas 12 Elam. 1.3 Recreational Vehicle Association, been here ten years, 14 been in association executive business for 40 years, 15 registered lobbyist. I grew up working in my uncle's RV 16 dealership and auto dealership in Baytown. 17 I'm not interested in serving in that capacity. Thank you. 18 19 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 20 Member Ferguson? Thank you, Mr. Richards. 21 MR. FERGUSON: Yes. 22 My name is Buddy Ferguson. I've been 2.3 representing manufacturers and distributors for 24 approximately 35 years in front of the agency, and also in 25

courts across the country.

Happy to be a part of the committee, but I'm 1 2 not interested in serving as the presiding officer. 3 you. 4 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 5 Member Gonzalez, are you on the call? Member 6 Gonzalez? 7 (No response.) 8 MR. RICHARDS: Okay. We'll move on to Member 9 Hall. 10 MR. HALL: Good afternoon. Tony Hall. I spent 2-1/2 years working for the Texas DMV and the last year 11 12 and a half I've been senior manager for government affairs for Carvana. For those of y'all that are not familiar 13 14 with Carvana, we do online vehicle sales. We have the 15 iconic vending machines; we are in approximately 38 16 states. So certainly have a full plate. I will forego 17 18 the opportunity. 19 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Hall. 20 Member Hayter? MR. HAYTER: Russell Hayter. 21 I'm glad to be 22 back on this committee again. I enjoyed serving last time 2.3 and look forward to another good year or two on this. 24 I am retired after 38 years as a licensed 25 insurance adjuster. I worked in special investigations

1	unit as an investigator, claims and auto salvage
2	supervisor and as a general claims supervisor.
3	I look forward to attending some of the
4	meetings in the future and glad to be here in a virtual
5	capacity right now. Thank you, sir.
6	MR. RICHARDS: Are you interested in serving as
7	presiding officer?
8	MR. HAYTER: Not as presiding officer.
9	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir.
10	Member Hicks? Member Hicks?
11	(No response.)
12	MR. RICHARDS: I'll move on. Member Murphy?
13	MR. MURPHY: William Murphy. I've been in the
14	auto industry for 30 years. I appreciate the opportunity
15	to be on this committee, but I'm not interested in serving
16	in that capacity. Thank you.
17	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir.
18	Member Prather? Member Prather?
19	MR. PRATHER: This is Steve Prather. I've been
20	in the car business all my adult life. I'm now retired.
21	I've owned car dealerships and I've been a vice president
22	for Sonic Automotive prior to my retirement.
23	And I'm not interested in serving as the
24	presiding officer, but I'm glad to be on your committee.
25	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir.

1	How about Member Provost? Member Provost?
2	(No response.)
3	MR. RICHARDS: Member Sims? Member Sims?
4	(No response.)
5	MR. RICHARDS: Member Sralla?
6	MR. SRALLA: I'm Trey Sralla, back on the
7	committee. Thanks for getting me back on the committee
8	this time around.
9	I'm in the power sports business, motorcycles,
10	for 32 years. I own a motorcycle dealership, Eddie Hill's
11	Fun Cycles in Wichita Falls, Texas. I'm currently the
12	president of the Texas Motorcycle Dealers Association and
13	I spent 12 years on the Wichita Falls Independent School
14	District Board of Trustees.
15	So I've got a lot of experience in committee
16	type work, and glad to be here. I don't necessarily need
17	to be the presiding officer; I'll be happy to serve
18	wherever needed.
19	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir.
20	MR. STARK: Good afternoon to everyone. Scott
21	Stark. I have served in my illustrious career in the
22	retail business, washing cars 30 years ago. Since then
23	I've been involved in multiple facets of it.
24	I'm the immediate past national dealer council
25	chairman for a major franchise. I also sat on a 501(c)(3)

for 12 years as the executive chairman of the board. 1 have been involved in operation or owning 14 different franchises over my lifetime, currently own four. 3 4 And while I'm happy to be back on the committee 5 from the previous time and I'd serve in any capacity, I do 6 not wish to pursue presiding officer. 7 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. Member Sullivan? 8 9 MR. SULLIVAN: Yes, sir. Thank you, David. 10 Mike Sullivan. I'm director of governmental affairs and corporate partnerships for Group One 11 12 Automotive, former Harris County tax assessor-collector 13 and voter registrar, and currently serve on the boards of 14 TADA and the Georgia Auto Dealers Association. 15 And I will second the nomination of the person 16 who volunteered to be presiding officer. 17 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Sullivan. Member Thomas? 18 19 MS. THOMAS: Hi. My name is Kalien Thomas. My 20 family owns Frontier Truck Parts and Equipment, and we 21 specialize in 18-wheelers and garbage trucks and garbage 22 truck parts. I have been with the company for 20 years. 2.3 And I am not interested in serving as presiding 24 officer at this time.

Thank you.

I was going 4 5 to call a five-minute break so everyone could consider 6 whether they want to serve as presiding officer, but since 7 we have one, I will not call a break and I will move on forward here with the following. 8 9 MVIRAC will use Robert's Rules of Order when 10 conducting their meetings. To take any action you must 11 first raise your hand or ask the presiding officer --12 which is me at the moment -- for the right to speak on a 1.3 matter. Once the presiding officer grants you the floor, 14 i.e., the right to speak, you must make a motion and 15 another person must second that motion. 16 To make a motion to name someone to be the 17 presiding officer, the motion could be: I make a motion to name John Smith to be the MVIRAC presiding officer. 18 19 You can even make a motion and name yourself as presiding officer. The 15 recommendations must be in writing and include any 16 necessary supporting materials. The presiding officer of 17 MVIRAC or the presiding officer's designee may appear before our Board to present the committee's advice and 18 19 recommendations. In addition, MVIRAC can provide advice 20 and recommendations to our executive director, Daniel Avitia, as necessary. 21 22 Our Board will consider MVIRAC's written 2.3 recommendations and reports that you submit. When MVIRAC 24 comes up with its recommendations at our next meeting,

MVIRAC can decide if it will attend the Board meeting and

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make a presentation in addition to submitting written materials or recommendations. It can determine how it will submit its recommendations to our Board at the next meeting.

I wanted to introduce these as options at this meeting to give you an opportunity to discuss or ask questions, if you had any, and time to think about the next advisory committee meeting.

Are there any questions about this particular agenda item?

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MR. RICHARDS: Hearing none, I'm going to move on to agenda item 2.F., implementation plan for this advisory committee.

This involves regarding amendments to

Administrative Rules Chapter 206, which pertains to

management of the agency; Chapter 215, Motor Vehicle

Distribution; Chapter 221, Salvage Vehicle Dealers; and

new Chapter 224, Adjudicative Practice and Procedure.

These amendments are the result of the rule review process

found under Government Code Section 2001.039.

Texas Government Code requires that a state agency occasionally review each of the rules to determine whether the reasons for initially adopting a rule continue to exist to make sure that the rule matches current

statute and matches current practices of the Texas DMV.

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Each of the chapters that we're going to discuss today is undergoing a rule review, typically every four years. The amendments that we will bring to you at the next meeting are intended to make sure that the rule matches the current statute and current practices.

I have two of my colleagues at the DMV that will be speaking on the chapters and some of the issues that they're looking at. I'll call first Monique Johnston, division director of the Motor Vehicle Division.

MS. JOHNSTON: Thanks, David.

Monique Johnston, director of the Motor Vehicle Division.

So as has already been covered by my colleague, today's purpose is previewing upcoming rules on which TxDMV will appreciate your feedback at future meetings. Chapter rule reviews are to be done every four years. In some cases it's been longer than that for us, so we have a lot of catching up to do.

In chapter rule review, each rule is looked at and we have three options: we can repeal it if it's no longer needed, keep it as is, or propose a rule change.

Speaking of change, a lot of change has happened since our last rule review. For example, the introduction of eLICENSING and some other systems means that processes and

tools have changed, so the rules need to be updated to reflect those changes. Additionally, we are looking at rule changes requested by license holders and industry best practices.

Chapters undergoing rule review, as we've already discussed, are Chapter 206 which is Management, Chapter 215 which covers Motor Vehicle Distribution, Chapter 221 which covers Salvage Vehicle Dealers, and a new chapter. As part of the rule review, we are looking at ways to make the rules easier to follow.

Today's contested case rules spread out among four chapters, 206, 215, 218 and 219, so we are proposing moving all contested case rules into one chapter, New Chapter 224.

Prior to the next meeting, we will send you a draft of the rule text to review and look forward to your input at the next time we meet.

Thank you.

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MR. RICHARDS: Members, our next speaker is Corrie Thompson, director of our Enforcement Division.

MS. THOMPSON: Good afternoon, everyone.

I don't have too much to add on to what the Motor Vehicle Division director, Monique Johnston, just spoke to. But the primary purpose of the rule amendments that we'll be bringing to this advisory committee, as

Monique stated, will be to kind of pull out all of the 1 mentions to contested case procedures for our 3 administrative hearings from Chapter 206, 215 as it 4 pertains to regular motor vehicle dealers, 221 as it 5 pertains to salvage dealers, and pull that all into a New 6 Chapter 224. 7 As it relates to Enforcement, we do also have 8 9

some recommended changes in Chapters 215 and 221 that will speak to changes to premises requirements and to records maintenance requirements.

So we will be looking forward to bringing that to the committee for input and recommendations going forward.

Thank you.

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MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Corrie.

Members, are there any questions regarding the remarks made by either Monique Johnston or Corrie Thompson at this time?

MR. DORAN: Presiding Officer, this is Member Doran.

MR. RICHARDS: Yes.

MR. DORAN: I had a question about the New Chapter 224. Is it anticipated that there will be any substantive changes to contested case rules, or is it merely collecting those from those four chapters that were

1	mentioned and ensuring that they're all properly placed
2	into the new chapter?
3	MS. THOMPSON: Corrie Thompson.
4	Yes, Member Doran, there are no planned
5	substantive changes whenever we are opening up the New
6	Chapter 224. The plan is to take out the existing rules
7	and restructure them so that we are covering everything
8	that's in existing rule, just in one chapter for ease of
9	use.
10	MR. DORAN: Thank you.
11	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Corrie.
12	Members, the next agenda item is public
13	comment. Are there any public comments, Tameka, today?
14	(No response.)
15	MR. RICHARDS: We have no public comments.
16	As such, the final agenda item for today's
17	meeting is agenda item number 4. Adjournment. If there's
18	no other business to discuss, I'll entertain a motion to
19	adjourn.
