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PROCEEDINGS

MR. RICHARDS: Good afternoon. My name is

David Richards, and I'm pleased to open the first meeting

of the Vehicle Titles and Registration Advisory Committee.

I'm an associate general counsel at the Texas Department

of Motor Vehicles.

For ease of reference, I will refer to this advisory committee as VTRAC, the acronym for the committee.

It is now 1:02 p.m., and I'm calling the VTRAC meeting for January 10, 2024, to order. I want to note for the record that the public notice of this meeting, containing all items on the agenda, was filed with the Office of Secretary of State on January 2, 2024.

This meeting is being held by telephone conference call in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 551.125. Members of the public may physically attend this meeting in person at 4000 Jackson Avenue, Building 1, Lone Star Room, Austin, Texas, 78731, or attend this meeting by calling the toll-free number which is posted in our agenda which was filed in the Office of Secretary of State on January 2, 2024.

We have four members of the advisory committee in person, with the vast majority of the advisory committee members participating remotely.

At this time, will all attendees please mute your phones for the entire duration of this meeting. I'm asking our meeting host to make sure that all participants' phones are muted except for advisory committee members and those who are presenting. Callers will be removed for any disruption, including background noise.

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I would like to remind all participants that this is a conference call meeting. Because this meeting is being held by conference call, there are a few things that will assist in making the meeting run smoother and assist the court reporter in getting an accurate record.

Number one, please identify yourself before speaking. Speak clearly. Remember that there may be a slight delay due to the conference call format so please wait a little bit longer than usual before responding to participants. Do not speak over others; please ask the presiding officer to proceed and be sure you get recognized before speaking.

And finally, participating in the room we have four members, please remember to press the button on your microphone to unmute before speaking and then press the same button to mute again after speaking.

I would also like to thank the court reporter who is transcribing this meeting today.

To make sure we have an accurate recording of this meeting, it's very important that the advisory committee members and anyone presenting today identify themselves clearly before speaking and speak clearly and slowly.

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If you wish to address the advisory committee or speak on an agenda item during today's meeting, please complete a speaker's sheet at the registration table prior to the agenda item being taken up by the advisory committee, or send an email to GCO_General@TxDMV.gov to register by providing the required information prior to the agenda item being taken up. Please identify the specific item you're interested in commenting on, your name and address and whether you're representing anyone or just speaking for yourself. Comment that doesn't pertain to an agenda item we'll take up at the end of the agenda under the general public comment agenda item. And again, just as a reminder, when addressing the advisory committee, please state your name and affiliation for the record.

Before we begin today, I'd like to remind all presenters and those in attendance of the rules of conduct at our advisory committee meetings. In the department's rules under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, Section 206.22, the presiding officer is given the authority to

1	supervise the conduct of meetings. This includes the
2	authority to determine when a speaker is being disruptive
3	of the meeting or is otherwise violating the timing or
4	presentation rules I just discussed. Disruptive speakers
5	will be muted, given a warning about disruptive behavior,
6	then removed from the meeting for any continued
7	disruption.

10	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you very much. Again, we
11	have a quorum, we're going to move on in the order of the
12	agenda.
13	Members, the next agenda item is 1.B in your
14	agenda, Welcoming remarks and introduction of advisory
15	committee members.
16	I will now turn the meeting over to TxDMV
17	Executive Director Daniel Avitia, who will make a few
18	remarks. Thank you.
19	MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Mr. Richards.
20	Good afternoon, and welcome, everyone. My name
21	is Daniel Avitia and I serve as the executive director of
22	the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.
23	Thank you for taking the time today to be part
24	of this introductory advisory meeting. Before we continue
25	with the introductions on the agenda, I want to provide

you with some background information on this committee.

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The TxDMV Board several years ago adopted rules surrounding the establishment of advisory committees, such as this one, to ensure the department would be inclusive and transparent. This is the second advisory committee to be established so far.

In 2019, the Vehicle Titles and Registration Advisory Committee was created and held a few meetings. The input of that committee's membership has proven very important and beneficial in helping the department move forward with some of our significant initiatives and projects. I am certain this committee will provide the same benefit and more.

This committee has some significant topics to cover and there is a lot of information to cover, including the agency's administrative rule review involving Chapter 217, Vehicle Titles and Registration, and potential amendments necessary to implement House Bill 718 and 3297 out of the 88th Legislative Session.

We welcome always your input and your honesty and your ideas. I cannot express to you enough how much I appreciate all of your time and your effort as we move forward through these processes. Please know that our staff and I are here to help you with whatever information you need and whatever we can make available to you. We

have access to information from other states and from national associations to provide more background and content as we move through these processes.

So once again, I appreciate you being here, I appreciate those of you watching, and I appreciate the time and the commitment that you've put forward to help support the TxDMV as we move through these processes.

David, back to you.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Executive Director Avitia, for your comments and warm welcome.

Members, we're going to move on to the next agenda item 2.A. Purpose, general information, and scope of the advisory committee -- housekeeping rules, if you will -- and a little background on the advisory committee functions and how you're guided as advisory committee members. The purpose of this particular advisory committee is to provide advice and make recommendation to the board of the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles on topics related to vehicle titles and registration issues.

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You've been given the charge by the department to provide advice and recommendations regarding what Mr.

Avitia just touched on: consideration of potential rule amendments necessary to implement House Bill 718 and House Bill 3297 that sprang from the 88th Legislative Session

regular session, this past session; and also importantly, as well, a rule review of Chapter 217 which deals with Vehicle Titles and Registration as well. No other topics will be discussed by this committee at this time. The committee provides advice and recommendations only as requested by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles or our board.

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I'd like to congratulate each of you on your appointment to this committee by the board, and thank you again for your valuable time to assist the department and the board by serving on this committee.

As appointed members of the committee, just for edification, the things that guide you as well, you're subject to both the Open Meetings Act and the Public Information Act.

First, the Open Meetings Act provides that all public business should be performed in public view. That means that any discussions you have regarding the work you perform in this committee must be done in a properly scheduled and posted meeting. Members of this committee can violate state law by having a series of discussions on policy issues outside of the advisory committee setting with other members. That is what is referred to as a walking quorum.

It is important that you refrain from

discussing advisory committee matters with other members outside of the scheduled and posted meetings. This includes avoiding meeting with members outside of a properly posted open meeting, not calling other members on the phone to discuss advisory committee matters, and not using social media to discuss matters that are before the advisory committee. Discussion with other members, even if less than quorum, outside of properly posted meetings for the purpose of secret deliberations can violate the Open Meetings Act which also carries with it criminal penalties.

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In addition, on the Public Information Act, information exchanged in your role as an advisory committee member can be subject to public disclosure, even if that information is on your private email or private cell phone. This is because as an advisory committee member, information you have regarding matters brought before the advisory committee may also subject you to the Open Records laws. Please be aware that any communications you have regarding the committee may be required to be disclosed in response to Open Records requests from the public.

Finally, in order to ensure that advisory committee meetings run smoothly, the advisory committees select a presiding officer. The presiding officer is in

charge of making sure Robert's Rules of Order are followed and to keep the proper decorum of the meeting. The presiding officer will open the meeting, much as I did today, and ensure that a quorum of members are present. The presiding officer makes sure that members make motions and second the motions before voting, and makes sure that no one member has the floor longer than others wishing to provide input.

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We will be happy to provide, as a staff, some overview training on the mechanics of the Robert's Rules of Order to anyone wanting to volunteer to be presiding officer of this meeting to ensure that it runs efficiently and carry out its purpose.

Just a few examples of how Robert's Rules of Order work. No member can speak twice to the same issue until everyone else wishing to speak has spoken on it once. All remarks by members must be directed to the presiding officer prior to speaking.

You obtain the floor by obtaining by raising your hand or asking the presiding officer for the floor or the right to speak on a matter, only when the person speaking has finished. There's a line of succession and procedure.

It is important to not interrupt others and to share the right to speak with all members of the advisory

committee. Remarks must be courteous and the members must avoid referring to viewpoints by alluding to other members by name or suggested motives.

You should expect, as advisory committee

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You should expect, as advisory committee members, for the presiding officer to protect your right to speak, even if it turns out that you're a minority of one in your opinion. The presiding officer helps to ensure that other members hear you out and to allow you the same voice as everyone else. This encourages members to give your fellow members their rightful turn to speak. Listen to them, you may hear something that affects the way you're thinking on a particular issue.

Lastly, we are recording this meeting. Before you speak, please state your name so that we have a record of each person and what they said.

Any questions on the administrative matters from any of the members at the moment?

(No response.)

MR. RICHARDS: Okay. Well, then I'll move on to agenda item 2.B of the agenda, that is nominations and selection of advisory committee presiding officer.

Again, for the record, my name is David
Richards, associate general counsel from the Office of
General Counsel here at DMV.

Texas law requires that an advisory committee

select a presiding officer from its membership. 1 presiding officer will preside over the advisory committee 3 and report to the TxDMV and our board. What I'd like to do now is I'm going to call on 4 5 each member. Give a little background after I call your 6 name and whether or not you would like to serve or be 7 considered serving as presiding officer. Member Dovalina? 8 9 MS. DOVALINA: Yes. My name is Sofia Dovalina. 10 I'm motor vehicle director for El Paso County, and at this point in time I would not want to be nominated. This 11 is my first time, so I'd like to get my feet wet. 12 1.3 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Dovalina. 14 Member Elam, did you join us on this call? 15 Member Elam? 16 (No response.) Member Fontenot? 17 MR. RICHARDS: MR. FONTENOT: Yes, hi. Member Fontenot. 18 19 happy to be here. I represent the salvage side of the 20 industry, primarily heavy trucks and automobiles. 21 We have locations in Beaumont, and I just 22 started another retail non-salvage operation car 2.3 dealership in San Antonio just recently. And I wouldn't 24 mind, I'll serve if you want me to.

MR. RICHARDS: I'm sorry. You're willing to

1	serve as the presiding officer?
2	MR. FONTENOT: Yes.
3	MR. RICHARDS: Nominated?
4	MR. FONTENOT: Yes.
5	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir.
6	MR. FONTENOT: Sure. Thank you.
7	MR. RICHARDS: I'll move on to Member French.
8	Member French, are you on the call?
9	She's shown as on the call. I'll come back.
10	Member French, can you hear me?
11	MS. FRENCH: Sorry about that. I am member
12	Michelle French, and I serve as the Denton County tax
13	assessor-collector and have been active in our Tax
14	Assessor-Collector Association community and have been
15	with the Denton County Tax Office for 40 years now, and
16	it's a pleasure to be able to serve on this board. I'm
17	looking forward to learning a lot and working with
18	everyone.
19	At this time I would not be interested in
20	serving as presiding officer. Also being new on this,
21	I'd like to sit back and be able to watch everybody else
22	and help wherever I can.
23	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member French.
24	Member Hall?
25	MR. HALL: Member Hall. Good afternoon,

everybody.

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So a little bit of my background: I spent ten and a half years actually working for the Texas DMV in the Vehicle Titles and Registration Division. The last two years I've spent on Carvana's government affairs team, where I focus on car registration policy all across the country and Carvana's "modernization efforts" and hoping to advance car registration processes across the country. I'd be happy to serve.

MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Hall.

Member Kuni?

MS. KUNI: Hello. Tawna Kuni. I'm from the Dallas area, and I represent insurance auto auctions, the auction side of the industry, and I've also worked in insurance for many years, previously the director of title center operations for IAA and recently took over as the area manager over all of the Texas branches. Happy to serve, but happy to support someone else as presiding officer.

MR. RICHARDS: A maybe, okay. Thank you.

Let me move on to Member Lake. Member Lake,

are you on the call?

MS. LAKE: Can you hear me?

MR. RICHARDS: Yes.

MS. LAKE: Sorry about that. I'm sorry; the

1	phone is giving me directions to do things. Can y'all
2	hear me okay?
3	MR. RICHARDS: Yes, we can.
4	MS. LAKE: Okay, sorry.
5	Yes, I'm with the tax assessor-collector's
6	office with Randall County in the Texas Panhandle, and
7	I've been with the county for 16 years now; I'm the office
8	manager. And it's an honor to be on this committee, but
9	this is my first year, so I would like to not be
10	considered as an officer at this time.
11	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Lake.
12	MS. LAKE: Thank you.
13	MR. RICHARDS: Member Luedecke.
14	MR. LUEDECKE: My name is Shay Luedecke.
15	Everybody misses my name. I am tax assessor-collector for
16	Bell county; I am also serving as president-elect for the
17	Texas Tax Assessor Association for the state.
18	I'll be sworn in as president for our
19	association in June of this year. I'm in my second term
20	as tax assessor-collector, I'm running for a third term
21	this year, and I appreciate your vote.
22	(General laughter.)
23	MR. LUEDECKE: I am willing to serve as either
24	first vice chair or second, but not as presiding officer.
25	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, Member Luedecke.

I'll get it right maybe by the end of the meeting. 1 2 Member Mendoza, are you on the call? Member Mendoza? 3 4 (No response.) 5 MR. RICHARDS: Member Millard? 6 MR. MILLARD: This is Member Millard. 7 Nacogdoches, Texas, where I've worked in the new car franchise industry for over 40 years, and been on this 8 9 committee since before COVID, and it seems like we kind of disbanded during that time, so this is the first meeting 10 back that I know of. 11 And I would rather see someone serve as 12 13 presiding officer that's present at the meeting myself, so 14 I would not want to serve; I'd rather see somebody that's 15 actually there at the meeting. 16 MR. RICHARDS: Okay. Thank you, sir. 17 Member Moore? Member Moore? Are you on the 18 call? I see you on the call. Can you unmute? I think 19 you're muted. 20 MEETING HOST: Member Moore seems to be having audio difficulties. 21 22 MR. RICHARDS: Okay. We're going to move on to 2.3 Member Nino. 24 MR. NINO: This is Member Nino. I am from El 25 Paso, Texas. I have experience as a full-service deputy,

but I am a member of the public as well. 1 At the moment I am not interested in serving as 2 3 presiding officer, and I'm looking forward to working with 4 everyone. 5 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 6 Member Ormand? 7 MR. ORMAND: Hi. My name is Bruce Ormand. am a GDN dealer, salvage dealer for over 40 years, 8 9 currently as well a full-service deputy here in Austin, 10 Texas, so we serve Travis County as well. And at this time I probably would not be interested in being a 11 presiding officer, try to help any other way I can. 12 13 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 14 Member Paschall? Member Paschall? 15 you're on the call. 16 Can you unmute, Member Paschall? 17 MR. PASCHALL: Can you hear me? 18 MR. RICHARDS: Yes, we can. Thank you. 19 MR. PASCHALL: Okay. My name is James 20 Paschall. I am the title supervisor for Red McCombs 21 Automotive Group in San Antonio. I've been supervisor for 22 about 15 years now. However, I don't think I'd be a good 2.3 fit to be a presiding officer. 24 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, sir. 25 Member Polk?

MS. POLK: My name is Member Polk, and I am 1 2 with Lee TranServices, located in Lufkin, Texas, right 3 down the road from Nacogdoches. I am the president of Lee 4 Trans, and I'm actually in my second term on this 5 committee. 6 I am not interested in being the presiding 7 officer, as I think that I might run into some problems 8 where I may not be available for board meetings. 9 you. 10 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you, appreciate it. Member Roberti? 11 12 MR. ROBERTI: Hi, everyone. My name is Bobby 13 Roberti. I'm with Wells Fargo Wealth Management in 14 Frisco, a member of the public. I am the previous 15 presiding officer of the one and a half of the two 16 official meetings we've had. 17 I've had a parallel career as the chair of the Frisco Planning and Zoning Commission, so I've run a 18 19 couple hundred meetings using Robert's Rules of Order, and 20 I'd be happy to serve again; it's been an honor to serve 21 on this board already. 22 And kind of interesting to note, I pay my taxes 2.3 to Member French, so there you go. 24 (General laughter.) 25 MR. RICHARDS: Thank you very much.

1	We'll move on to Member Smith. Member Smith?
2	(No response.)
3	MR. RICHARDS: It doesn't look like Member
4	Smith is on the call.
5	Member Torres? Member Torres? I think you're
6	on mute.
7	Member Torres, can you unmute
8	MEETING HOST: Member Torres is currently
9	unmuted. I believe they are still having audio
10	difficulties.
11	MR. RICHARDS: Okay, we'll move on. Member
12	Vincent?
13	MS. VINCENT: Hi. My name is Christal Vincent.
14	I am currently a fleet operations manager for
15	Southwestern Public Service Company.
16	It's owned by Excel Energy, which is a public
17	utility company that provides energy to customers in eight
18	states. I'm over a fleet of about 1,200 units, and I am
19	not ready to commit to that position at this time.
20	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you.
21	And finally, Member Wolf. Member Wolf?
22	(No response.)
23	MR. RICHARDS: Member Wolf, I guess, is not on
24	the call.
25	Members, VTRAC will use Robert's Rules of Order

when conducting meetings, as stated previously. To take any action, you must first raise your hand or ask the presiding officer -- which is me at the moment -- for the right to speak on a matter. Once the presiding officer grants you the floor and/or the right to speak, you must make a motion and another person must second the motion.

To make a motion to name someone to be the presiding officer, the motion could be, I make a motion to name John Smith to be the VTRAC presiding officer, for example. You can even make a motion to name yourself to be the president officer, should you choose.

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To second a motion, on the other hand, a different member should say, I second the motion, or Second. A person cannot second their own motion.

My notes indicate thus far, members, that

Member Fontenot, Member Hall and Member Roberti have said

yes of their willingness to be nominated for the presiding

officer position, and for Member Kuni it was a maybe.

So does anyone have a motion they'd like to make at this time to name someone to be the VTRAC presiding officer?

MR. RICHARDS: Member Luedecke.

MR. LUEDECKE: Member Luedecke. I move that we nominate Member Roberti as the presiding chair.

1	Member Roberti as the president officer. Is there a
2	second?
3	MR. MILLARD: Millard seconds.
4	MR. RICHARDS: We have a motion and a second to
5	name Member Roberti as presiding officer.
6	Members, I'll call your name and ask you
7	whether you vote to name Member Roberti as presiding
8	officer by stating your name and then indicating yes or
9	no.
10	Member Dovalina?
11	MS. DOVALINA: Yes.
12	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you.
13	Member Elam, I think, is not here.
14	Member Fontenot?
15	MR. FONTENOT: Yes, Member Fontenot, and I
16	support Mr. Roberti wholeheartedly.
17	MR. RICHARDS: Yes, sir. Thank you.
18	Member French?
19	MS. FRENCH: Yes, I support that.
20	MR. RICHARDS: Thank you.
21	Member Hall?
22	MR. HALL: Member Hall, yes.

MR. RICHARDS: Okay, members, we're going to move on to agenda item 2.F. Implementation plan for advisory committee recommendations.

What you're being charged with has been mentioned twice, I guess, thus far during this meeting, looking at any necessary amendments to implement House Bill 718, which pertains to the metal license plate bill, and/or House Bill 3297, which pertains to the vehicle inspection safety program. Both of those bills came out

of the 88th session and were signed by the governor. And secondly, for a rule review involving 43 Texas

Administrative Code, Chapter 217, pertaining to Vehicle

Titles and Registration.

Just as a matter or primer regarding the rule review first; agencies are charged with reviewing their existing rules every four years, and then every four years thereafter. The focus by the agency is whether we should readopt with amendments or repeal a rule as a result of reviewing the rule under this particular section. And again, as I mentioned, that is Section 2001.039 of the Texas Government Code. Finally, a state agency's review of a rule must include an assessment of whether the reasons for initially adopting the rule continue to exist.

What we have done in the past with other advisory committees is provide you -- which is what we'll do here -- with copies, I guess electronic copies we'll send of 217. The agency has been reviewing Chapter 217 for any necessary edits over the last several months, and will continue to do so, but we're asking this advisory committee to also provide us with input through your review.

The next meeting we'll be talking more substantively about not only 217, but also any potential amendments that need to be implemented to House Bills 718

and 3297. Basically what you're looking at -- for those of you who haven't dealt with this, real quickly there are 12 subchapters in Chapter 217. One, obviously -- or two, obviously, Motor Vehicle Titles and Registration, Registration and Titling Systems, Non-Repairable and Salvage Motor Vehicles, Title Liens and Claims, Motor Vehicle Records, Inspections, Deputies, Processing and Handling Fees, Performance Quality Recognition Program, and finally, the last two, Electronic Signatures, and Assembled Vehicles. So those are the subchapters you'll be looking at, those that have changes.

We'll give you an edited version, edited in the sense that our staff has looked at them already. Some of you may have been on another advisory committee so you're familiar with this.

Same thing will go with House Bill 718 and House Bill 3297. Our staff has looked at both of those bills and looked at potential amendments that the staff feels might be in order, so you'll be made aware of that, it's my understanding. So far, Chapter 215, which is the Motor Vehicle Distribution or Motor Vehicle Dealer chapter, is one for 718. And then 217, which is the Vehicle Titles and Registration Chapter that we're going to give you as well, is going to be impacted by House Bill 718.

Finally, 3297 -- thus far we've identified 1 2 Chapter 217 and Chapter 219 as potential chapters that might be impacted by House Bill 3297. 3 So again, we'll give you -- Mr. Hall, you 4 5 asked -- more than two days notice to review all of these. 6 Today is the 10th of January, I'm not sure when we'll get 7 them out, I'm sure it's sooner than later. 8 Do you have an idea, Laura? Not sure? 9 (No audible response.) 10 MR. RICHARDS: You'll have plenty of time to look at House Bill 718 and 3297, as well as 217, and then 11 12 our next meeting come back and we'll discuss any of your 13 suggested edits, changes, repeals, adoptions, should we 14 keep something, should we get rid of something, any 15 suggested language. And that will happen on February 22, 16 and I assume we'll be here and it will be a virtual call 17 as well. Let me move back to my agenda. Does anybody 18 19 have any questions about that before I move on? 20 MR. LUEDECKE: Member Luedecke. MR. RICHARDS: Member Luedecke. 21 22 MR. LUEDECKE: Member Luedecke. 2.3 My question is how far in advance are we going 24 to get the new rules that we're going to be reviewing on

February 22. I don't want to get them the same day and

have to make a decision on those rules. 1 2 MR. RICHARDS: I'll defer to my boss. How long 3 do you think? 4 MS. MORIATY: This is Laura Moriaty, general 5 counsel. 6 I'm hoping we get them to you -- in my dreams 7 we get them to you weeks in advance, but I dedicate that 8 we will get you at least a week. Last time we only 9 managed to get three days, so we're going to do better 10 than that. But hopefully you'll have at least a week to review these. 11 12 Because they are across several chapters, it 13 will take a little bit of work. We're working on it and 14 we're going to do better than we did last time. 15 MR. LUEDECKE: Thank you. 16 MR. RICHARDS: Any other questions, members? 17 (No response.) MR. RICHARDS: Hearing none -- I'm sorry. 18 19 ahead, Member French. 20 MS. FRENCH: Once we have the information from the staff and we have the chance to be able to review them 21 22 and then also come back together and talk about these 2.3 things, at what point will these recommendations be made 24 to the DMV Board? And then also at what point do we get 25 any feedback from the DMV Board based on the

3	MR. RICHARDS: So our meeting is in June,
4	correct, June 2024 in which the recommendations of this
5	advisory committee will be presented to the board. I'm
6	not sure as to the exact date, but June of 2024.

9	MR. RICHARDS: You're very welcome. Thanks for
10	asking.
11	Any other questions?
12	(No response.)
13	MR. RICHARDS: All right. Hearing none,
14	Tameka, do we have any public comment?
15	(No response.)
16	MR. RICHARDS: Okay. Members, that's agenda
17	item number 3, public comment. We have none to entertain
18	today.
19	The next agenda item is agenda item number 4,
20	which is adjournment. Unless there's any further
21	business, I'd like to entertain a motion to adjourn.
22	MR. ROBERTI: Motion to adjourn.
23	MR. RICHARDS: Motion to adjourn. Is there a
