4 5	INTRODUCTION. The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (department) adopts amendments to 43 Texas
6	Administrative Code (TAC) §206.92 and §206.93 and adopts new §206.98 concerning advisory
7	committees. The department adopts §§206.92, 206.93, and 206.98 without changes to the proposed text
8	as published in the September 1, 2023, issue of the <i>Texas Register</i> (48 TexReg 4799). The rules will not be
9	republished.
10	REASONED JUSTIFICATION. The amendments and new section are necessary to implement the Sunset
11	Advisory Commission's adopted recommendation 1.7 in the Staff Report with Final Results, revised June
12	2019. The Sunset Advisory Commission recommended that the department establish advisory
13	committees to provide expertise for rulemaking and other issues, and to adopt rules regarding standard
14	committee structure and operating criteria.
15	An amendment to §206.92 is necessary to expand the definition of "advisory committee" by
16	adding Transportation Code, §643.155 as a statute under which an advisory committee may be created,
17	to include the enabling statute for a separate advisory committee for rules involving motor carriers
18	transporting household goods.
19	Amendments to §206.93 are necessary to allow the advisory committees to report to the
20	department by providing recommendations either to the board or to the executive director. This would
21	create more flexibility in how the committees report and would make the language consistent with the
22	definition of "advisory committee" in §206.92(1) and with Transportation Code, §1001.031(a).

Another amendment to §206.93(a) corrects a grammatical error. Advisory committees are required to meet and carry out their functions upon a request from the department or the board for advice and recommendations on any issues. The request can be on a single issue or multiple issues.

An amendment to §206.93(d) removes the requirement that advisory committee members have an interest or expertise in the subject area of the advisory committee. This language is redundant with the statutory language that is already contained in Transportation Code, §1001.031 and is therefore unnecessary.

8 An amendment to §206.93(i) removes an unnecessary hyphen to correct a grammatical error.

9 The new §206.98 is necessary to implement Transportation Code, §643.155, which requires the 10 department to appoint a rules advisory committee pertaining to motor carriers transporting household 11 goods. Section 643.155 requires a department representative to serve on the advisory committee. In 12 contrast, Transportation Code, §1001.031 does not require department representatives to serve on the 13 advisory committee that considers other consumer protection and customer service issues. Therefore, 14 dividing the advisory committees so that the committee on which department employees serve considers 15 only rules involving motor carriers transporting household goods allows the most efficient use of 16 department employees' time. It also avoids diluting the influence of perspectives from outside the 17 department on other consumer protection and customer service issues, for which statute does not require 18 the perspective of department representatives on the advisory committee. New §206.98 sets in rule the 19 purpose, tasks, reporting requirements, and expiration of the HGRAC, as is required for advisory 20 committees under Government Code, §2110.005. New §206.98 has an expiration date for the HGRAC of 21 July 7, 2027, to match the expiration date of the other department advisory committees.

1	STATUTORY AUTHORITY. The department adopts amendments to §206.92 and §206.93 and adopts new
2	§206.98 under Transportation Code, §643.155, which authorizes the department to adopt rules to create
3	a rules advisory committee consisting of the public, the department, and representatives of motor carriers
4	transporting household goods using small, medium, and large equipment; Transportation Code,
5	§1002.001, which authorizes the board to adopt rules that are necessary and appropriate to implement
6	the powers and duties of the department under the Transportation Code and other laws of this state;
7	Government Code, §2110.005, which requires state agencies establishing advisory committees to make
8	rules stating the purpose and tasks of the committee and describing the manner in which the committee
9	will report to the agency; and Government Code, §2110.008, which allows state agencies establishing
10	advisory committees make rules designating the date an advisory committee will be abolished.

10	§206.93. Advisory Committee Operations and Procedures.
11	(a) Role of advisory committee. The role of an advisory committee under this subchapter is to
12	provide advice and recommendations to the board or the executive director. Advisory committees shall
13	meet and carry out their functions upon a request from the department or board for advice and
14	recommendations on any issues.
15	(b) Appointment of advisory committee. The board shall appoint members to an advisory
16	committee by selecting potential members from a list provided to the board by the executive director.
17	Each advisory committee shall elect from its members a presiding officer, who shall report the advisory
18	committee's recommendations to the board or the executive director. The executive director may
19	designate a division or divisions of the department to participate with, or to provide subject-matter
20	expertise, guidance, or administrative support to the advisory committee as necessary.
21	(c) Member qualifications. Members shall have knowledge about and interests in, and represent
22	a broad range of viewpoints about, the work of the committee or applicable division(s). Board members
23	shall not serve as advisory committee members.

1 (d) Composition of advisory committees. In making appointments to the advisory committees, 2 the board shall, to the extent practical, ensure representation of members from diverse geographical 3 regions of the state. 4 (e) Committee size and quorum requirements. An advisory committee shall be composed of a 5 reasonable number of members not to exceed 24 as determined by the board. A simple majority of 6 advisory committee members will constitute a quorum. An advisory committee may only deliberate on 7 issues within the jurisdiction of the department or any public business when a quorum is present. 8 (f) Terms of service. Advisory committee members will serve terms of four years. A member will 9 serve on the committee until the member resigns, is dismissed or replaced by the board, or the 10 member's term expires. 11 (g) Member training requirements. Each member of an advisory committee must receive 12 training regarding the Open Meetings Act, Government Code, Chapter 551; and the Public Information 13 Act, Government Code, Chapter 552. 14 (h) Compliance with Open Meetings Act. The advisory committee shall comply with the Open 15 Meetings Act, Government Code, Chapter 551. 16 (i) Public input and participation. The advisory committee shall accept public comments made in 17 person at advisory committee meetings or submitted in writing. Public comments made in writing 18 should be submitted to the advisory committee five business days in advance of the advisory committee 19 meeting with sufficient copies for all members. 20 (j) Reporting recommendations. Recommendations of the advisory committee shall be reported 21 to the board at a board meeting prior to board action on issues related to the recommendations. The 22 recommendations shall be in writing and include any necessary supporting materials. The presiding 23 officer of the advisory committee or the presiding officer's designee may appear before the board to

1	present the committee's advice and recommendations. This subsection does not limit the ability of the
2	advisory committee to provide advice and recommendations to the executive director as necessary.
3	(k) Board use of advisory committee recommendations. In developing department policies, the
4	board shall consider the written recommendations and reports submitted by advisory committees.
5	(I) Reimbursement. The department may, if authorized by law and the executive director,
6	reimburse advisory committee members for reasonable and necessary travel expenses.
7	(m) Expiration dates for advisory committees. Unless a different expiration date is established
8	by the board for the advisory committee, each advisory committee is abolished on the fourth
9	anniversary of its creation by the board.

11	§206.98. Household Goods Rules Advisory Committee (HGRAC).
12	(a) The HGRAC is created to make recommendations, as requested by the department or board,
13	to modernize and streamline the rules adopted under Transportation Code §643.153(a) and (b).
14	(b) The HGRAC shall comply with the requirements of §206.93 of this title (relating to Advisory
15	Committee Operations and Procedures).
16	(c) The HGRAC shall expire on July 7, 2027.
