2004 SOUTH DAKOTA CERTIFICATE OF TITLE SECURITY FEATURES

Security Paper:

- 1) "Diamond-weave" watermark pattern that was manufactured into the paper when the paper was made. This watermark pattern is present throughout the entire length and width of each title.
- 2) Paper contains "printlock" which is a chemical treatment in the paper that causes the laser printer toner to adhere to the title paper much better, making toner erasure, flaking, scraping, peeling or lift-off more difficult.
- 3) Paper contains chemical reagents that stain the paper different colors depending upon the type of altering or forging substance used. If an acid is used to remove or alter data, a pink stain will permanently appear on the title. If bleach is used as an altering agent, a brown stain will appear in the altered area. If a solvent is used, a blue or blue/black stain will appear in the altered area.

Security Printing:

- 1) High-resolution Banknote-engraved border on the face of the title, printed in blue erasure sensitive ink.
- 2) All of the blue ink on the face and back of the title is erasure sensitive.
- 3) The line above the bottom border on the face of the title appears as a solid line but is actually the words, "certificate of title" printed in a very small type font.
- 4) On the back of the title, in both "seller must complete" sections, the signature lines for the "seller/dealer" and for the "purchaser(s) or authorized agent" are actually a series of micro-printed characters which appear as a solid line.
- 5) Blue and red ink on the face of the title are printed as a prismatic (or rainbow) printing, which is difficult for a copier to duplicate.
- 6) The word "void" will appear numerous times in the bottom 3 inches of the face of the title if the title is photocopied or duplicated.
- 7) The consecutive number in the lower right-hand corner of the face of the title is printed in red fluorescent ink.
- 8) On the face of the title, at the bottom center, the warning band "any alterations or erasures void title" appears.
